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
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This quote from Louis Pasteur fits the Centre-du-Québec tourist region perfectly, since "wonder" is certainly the feeling you get when you explore it.

There's actually a region called **L'Érable** in Centre-du-Québec. Here you can visit Ferme d'Évélyne and sample some of the farm's maple and berry-inspired products, and also Jackalhop microbrewery to taste some local beers. Specialty meats and fine cheeses are a real highlight of the area. Pack a lunch and take the family on a picnic in one of the many beautiful green spaces. In fall, you can follow the Balade Gourmande agritourism circuit and discover the best of L'Érable. You're in for a real treat!

Foodies will also love exploring the vast territory of **Victoriaville and its surrounding area**. Enjoy a great diversity of products coupled with romantic countryside scenery. Take one of the small roads and you're almost certain to find a dedicated artisan who's the pride of the local area! Must-visit places include the popular Fromagerie du Presbytère with its festive Fridays and La Grange Pardue brewery with its magnificent outdoor terrace — a great spot to hang out with friends. For a one-of-a-kind foodie experience, head to the winery Vignoble Les Côtes du Gavet. Pull up a chair on the terrace and treat yourself to a delicious wood-fired pizza. You'll want to keep going back!



After exploring the culinary treasures of L'Érable and Victoriaville, head to Le Laurier restaurant, located in Hotel Le Victorin. Here the chef has created a wonderfully varied and tasty menu! For another sweet-tasting stop, check out the honey house and ready-to-eat shop **Un Goût de miel**, a hidden gem in the charming municipality of Sainte-Clotilde-de-Horton. Your senses will be working overtime with the smells wafting from the kitchen and the authentic taste of wildflower honey. Be sure to sample their orange-ginger flavoured honey (arômiel) — a perfect addition to a picnic featuring their must-try discovery plate. Want to learn more about bees? Take their workshop Une ruche comment ça marche (How a hive works), followed by a honey tasting. New this year: a special kind of honey popcorn. With so many delicious products to sample, you'll want to keep coming back.

Take a scenic drive that the whole family will enjoy along the **Tournée de la Saint-François** route through picturesque countryside. From Windsor and Drummondville to Lac Saint-Pierre, you'll discover the charming Rivière Saint-François. There are plenty of places along this peaceful riverside route to stop and take in the magnificent views. Enjoy local products, hiking trails and cultural destinations along the way. Lots of points of interest await you!

When you get to Drummondville, stop by **Rose Drummond**. It's hard to miss their eye-catching sign from highway 20! You'll be greeted by the fragrant aroma of roses and freshly ground coffee as you stroll around the tropical greenhouse, open all year.

Enjoy a hot drink and a bite to eat at the Rose Café, which serves meals featuring vegetables grown onsite. Coffee, flowers and fresh products — what more could you ask for?

Add an urban touch to your getaway with a tour of the **Marché Public de Drummondville** and its wide variety of fresh and locally-grown products. This is one of the few public markets open year-round, offering produce according to the season. A wonderful place to make interesting finds and learn some new culinary trends. Every visit is a memorable food experience. Come and enjoy the friendly atmosphere and savour fresh produce 365 days a year. It's sure to satisfy your every craving!

Located near the St. Lawrence River, **Microbrasserie La Flûte à Bec** offers a different menu every season, featuring local products. Try the pretzel bread with seasoned butter, paired with a tasty tartare. Or chow down on a salmon filet, burger or pizza topped with ingredients that change with the seasons. From time to time, singers (chansonniers) and musical groups are onsite to entertain customers

Take a seat on the terrace and enjoy a craft beer, cocktail or glass of wine with a panoramic view of fields stretching as far as the eye can see.







Continuing along Route 132, you'll come to the magnificent vineyard **Le Fief de la Rivière** in Bécancour. Enjoy a picnic in this beautiful spot, surrounded by no fewer than 12,000 vines! A stop here would be incomplete without tasting their award-winning wines, all under the Globul appellation. For a real treat, try the Prestige tasting, for groups of 4 or more (reservation required). This includes a tasting of all their wines, a tour of the facilities and a souvenir glass with the vineyard's logo.

A must on your list of places to visit.

For lunch, head to **Fromagerie l'Ancêtre** to try their brand new offering: an authentic poutine made on-site topped with cheese curds fresh out of the vat. The cheese factory is a must for a refreshing break during a bike ride — treat yourself to an ice cream made from organic milk or a savoury cheese platter. Planning a special dinner with family or friends? Rent a raclette machine on-site and make it a meal they'll remember! Awarded best cheddar in Quebec and best organic unsalted butter, Fromagerie l'Ancêtre is sure to impress!

Not far from here is the site of the **Marché Godefroy** artisan and produce market, now in its 30th season. Mark your calendar for the opening weekend *méchoui* (spit roast) on May 18 and 19. A special program has been put together in honour of the market's 30th anniversary. Come and discover 30 producers and agri-processors showcasing their mouth-watering products! You just may find that secret ingredient you've been searching for.

For a tasty breakfast, make your way further down the Route des Navigateurs to **La Maison de Bibi Café-Boutique**. Stock up on homemade delicacies at the fine food shop: fudge, jams, confits and desserts, all made with local products.

Expect a warm welcome! Reserve ahead as seating is limited at this little gem of a restaurant.

A few minutes away from La Maison de Bibi, you'll find **Ô Quai des Brasseurs**. This restaurant and microbrewery offers a wide range of beers brewed on-site. Enjoy a meal on their terrace, with a breathtaking view of the river. If you're out on the water, simply dock your boat at the visitor quay and grab a bite to eat. Good bistro food combined with a peaceful waterfront setting — perfect!

Museums and interpretation centres are a real goldmine of information to satisfy the most curious minds! Whether you're passionate about history, food, nature or heritage, an enriching experience awaits you in Centre-du-Québec's museums and interpretation centres!

Take a drive into the back-country and discover the small villages that bring the region alive. Plan a stop in Inverness to visit the impressive **Musée du Bronze d'Inverness**. Learn about the fascinating world of art foundry in Quebec — you'll gain a whole new appreciation for bronze sculptures. The museum features a permanent exhibition complete with a virtual reality experience, summer exhibitions, sculpting demos and workshops open to all. There's no lack of activities to broaden your cultural horizons!

As soon as you get to Drummondville, make your way to the **Village Québécois d'Antan** for a captivating journey back to the 19th century. In this heritage village, you'll be greeted by lively villagers in traditional costumes who will take you on an immersive and entertaining adventure through time. Change of scene guaranteed! Take a stroll through the village to enjoy all the fun and educational activities designed for the whole family. Come night fall, the village comes alive in a different way with a truly one-of-a-kind multimedia experience designed by Moment Factory. You'll see the village illuminated in a new way, turned into a place of wonder that's full of surprises.



Next, take a peek into the fascinating world of photography in Drummondville's **Musée de la Photographie Desjardins**. The museum is home to one of the world's very first mass-produced cameras! Its new permanent exhibition of cameras takes you on a journey through history: early photography, famous photos and all sorts of stories and fun facts.

There's also a darkroom and various temporary photo exhibits that change with the seasons.

Then head to Odanak to discover Quebec's first Indigenous museum: the **Musée** des Abénakis. Have fun visiting the exhibits, bring a snack to eat in the picnic area overlooking the Rivière Saint-François, and take a walk along the Tolba trail to discover the local flora and fauna. Groups of ten or more can have fun tapping into their creativity with various activities and workshops (reservations required): learn to make necklaces, corn husk dolls or dream catchers, or sample traditional snacks. Top off your visit at the Indigenous arts and crafts shop and take home an authentic souvenir of your experience!

Nestled in Nicolet's verdant countryside is the beautiful ancestral home and studio of Rodolphe Duguay and Jeanne L'Archevêque: **Maison et atelier Rodolphe-Duguay**. Take a guided tour of the home and studio and learn about this talented couple who devoted their lives to creating art and raising their six children. Also offered are exhibits featuring professional visual artists and creative workshops.

Sit out on the magnificent grounds to relax a while and take in the fresh air. It's the perfect place to get some creative inspiration!

To learn more about this artist, head over to the **Musée des cultures du monde** to see the exhibit "50 ans plus tard, Un regard sur l'œuvre de Duguay." Don't leave without also learning all about Centre-du-Québec's famous dish in the most unusual exhibit "La poutine. Une culture à toutes les sauces." Be sure to mark your calendar for World Poutine Day on July 20! The museum will be putting on various activities. On your way out, pick up a little something at the museum's gift shop, which features a variety of Quebec artists and artisans.




Next, take a delightful tour of nature and give your senses a treat at the **Musée de la biodiversité du Ouébec.**

This summer, visit Parc Marie-Victorin and check out the seventh and newest themed garden "Mysterious carnivore". featuring carnivorous plants. Summer Theatre and Entertainment



Follow the **Billy Stuart Circuit**, an app that invites you to travel the roads of Victoriaville and its surroundings to take on various missions alongside Billy Stuart and his friends. You'll need to keep your eyes peeled for clues, be clever at deciphering puzzles, and be fit enough to take on challenges! This quest for children aged 6 to 12 is based on the famous Billy Stuart series, written by Alain M. Bergeron and illustrated by Sampar, both from the region and well known to young readers. It's quite an adventure!

From June 28 to August 17, there are laughs galore at the **Maison des arts Desjardins Drummondville** in Drummondville with the play **Appelez-moi Stéphane**, written by

Claude Meunier and Louis Saia. This comedy directed by André Robitaille will make
you see theatre in a new light. It stars Patrice Bélanger, Véronic DiCaire, Bernard

Fortin, Diane Lavallée, Dominic Paquet and Tammy Verge. "Five people from different
backgrounds sign up for evening classes in theatre arts. Teacher Stéphane suggests
they create a play in which each person acts out a part of their own story. A whole new

Putting the outdoors on the schedule

Spending time outdoors and breathing in some fresh air is always good for you. So why not get away from the daily grind and recharge your batteries with an outdoor activity?



How about a bike ride through scenic country or hiking the trails in one of our region's magnificent regional parks? Pack a small bag and put on your walking shoes; or get the bike mounted on the car, then head out into nature!

On your own or with the family, plan a bike ride in the **L'Érable region**. Stay cool under the tunnels of shade trees, take in scenic views stretching over 50 km, enjoy flatter trails alongside the river, or give your legs a workout in the lower Appalachian Mountains. Looking for a place to mountain bike? Head to Mont Apic. For a more leisurely ride on a bike path, try the Parc linéaire des Bois-Francs. It has beautiful rest areas and 77 km of trails (a section of Route Verte #1) that wind through the charming municipalities of L'Érable! The varied terrain offers challenges to all types of cyclists!

Want to enjoy the great outdoors with your dog? Bring your leashed pooch to the **Parc régional des Grandes**-

Coulées in the Forêt ancienne sector of Plessisville. You'll find 12 km of flat trails accessible to hikers of all skill levels, four rustic campsites, one shelter, 30 ponds set up for fishing, 18 obstacle course modules and one dog park right in the heart of the forest. Take a break at one of the picnic shelters dotted along the trails and revel in the magnificent view of the Rivière Noire. Parc régional des Grandes-Coulées is the place to go for lots of fresh air and fun with your four-legged friend.



If you're in the mood for some exercise, take the family out on two wheels. The **Parc linéaire des Bois-Francs** was developed on a former railway line with mostly stone dust trails and is a great place for a bike ride. The 77 km of trails with a maximum grade of 2% make their way through plains, majestic forests and nine municipalities. A fun and interesting way to explore the area! Various rest stops, often bordered by a river, make for a perfect place to relax in a peaceful setting before continuing your exploration of Centre-du-Québec's breathtaking natural environment.

Beer hikes, bike-cheese trails, paddleboard-gin circuits — **Victoriaville and its surrounding area** offer a myriad of ways to combine foodie and outdoor pleasures. Take time to breathe in the fresh air, far from the crowds, and enjoy the multitude of choices available. The fabulous Véloroute des Appalaches and its 21 routes take you through picture-perfect landscapes, where you can find the best local produce. Want to get on the water? Go paddling on the Route bleue Kingsey Falls-Danville and take in the peaceful scenery! For something a little different, introduce the kids to trout fishing on the Pêche Nicolet circuit, located on one of Quebec's most beautiful rivers. If you're up for a challenging sporting event, check out the Notos Ultra-Trail race, and the Défis des Appalaches, which includes a local food discovery aspect. There are plenty of ways to stay active this summer and discover the region's specialties!

Covering over 40 km of terrain with very diverse vegetation, the varied trails take you alongside the river, lead you through some more mountainous areas and offer a fantastic view of the Appalachians. Looking for a longer hike? Venture out on the 26 km trail, which features several viewpoints of the region between Mont Arthabaska and the hamlet of Trottier.


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
